Code	Presenter	Workshop Title (P = Primary, M = Middle, S = Senior Secondary)
2E	Christina Challenger & Catherine Emmerson	Flip It! (M/S) "Flip" your classroom and maximise the time you have with your students. *Participants will need to bring their devices to this session.
2F	Cindy Pitkin & Ayako Uchikawa	From Curriculum to Classroom – Incorporating Language in Primary Lessons (P) This session will present ideas for how to maximise the use of Japanese in the primary school classroom. It will look at the language examples and activities in the Australian Curriculum and suggest how to help students incorporate this Japanese into their daily usage.
2G	Katie Chandler	<i>Kamishibai</i> – the Art of Japanese Story Telling (P) This session takes a look at the ancient skill of storytelling. Participants will learn how to create their own <i>kamishibai</i> , with a focus on sentence building (word order and particles).

3A	The Japan Foundation Cathy Jonak	Classroom Activities on the theme of 'Fuji-san' (M) After briefly reviewing the main aims of the Australian Curriculum, participants work through a number of classroom activities on the focus question 'What is Fuji-san?' They then consider their application to the AC.
3B	MCJLE Anne de Kretser	どういいうみですか ~ What does it mean? (P) Linking to the Australian Curriculum, this session will explore the cultural and intercultural understandings required at the primary school level, looking at language examples and activities as a platform for learning about and developing an understanding of Japanese language and culture.
3C	Kathleen Duquemin	Teaching Japanese Literacy Through Texts (P/M/S) In this workshop, participants will explore different kinds of texts - such as song lyrics, picture books, familiar games and LI texts - and how they can be used within a Japanese classroom to focus learning and engage learners. A number of existing texts will be explored with participants creating links to their classroom practice.
3D	Heather Mansfield, Rachel Francis & Catherine Emmerson	Sustaining Senior School Students (S) This session will discuss how to use engagement and acceleration techniques to increase senior school numbers. The presenters will talk about how they accelerated their Year 9 students straight into Year 11 and what kind of topics they covered to keep them engaged and motivated.
3E	Trish Takahashi	Books in the Japanese Classroom (P) This workshop introduces the series, "Rokunin no Tomodachi" and provides ideas and strategies for maximising the use of the readers in the Japanese classroom.
3F	Grant Nielsen	Make May at your school "Ani-May" (M) This workshop will explain how to celebrate <i>anime</i> and <i>manga</i> at your school in the month of May. There will be key ideas for displays, activities, movies, competitions and language learning. Aimed at Years 6-10.
3G	Simon Tennent	<i>Kanji Matters</i> (M/S) This session will introduce simple activities that can be used in the classroom to engage students' learning and recognition of <i>kanji</i> . These activities can be used as "Warm Up Activities", "Cool Down Activities", "whole lesson activities" or "10-minute double lesson breakers".
